




→Throughout the Civil War and Reconstruction the number of black female artists and writers emerged before finally reaching American culture in the 1920s, starting the Harlem Renaissance

- Weapon engraving












Clementine Hunter 1886 - 1988

till 1970s











Pauline Powell Burns 1872 - 1912

- → Held an exhibit of her paintings in 1890. Then went on to get the title of "the bright musical star of her state" and













Tamara Natalie Madden 1975 - 2017




LoÏs Jones 1905 - 1998
